Don't fail to respond to the grace God offers. Otherwise bitterness will destroy your life and poison the lives of those around you. Don't fall into impurity. Don't lose your reverence for the Lord. If you do, you may lose your due inheritance as a child of God.

Our ancestors went to Mount Sinai. Thunder roared; lightning flashed; and the mountain was covered with smoke. God's voice terrified them and they refused to listen. We have come to Mount Zion, the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. Listen to the voice of God or you will be lost.
